MISSION STATEMENT

The Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole is committed to promoting public safety, utilizing sound decision making practices that include evidence-based approaches, employing effective methods to aid offenders in reentering society and to reduce recidivism, addressing the needs of crime victims, and improving county adult probation and parole services.

INTRODUCTION

The Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole is an independent State agency under the jurisdiction of the Governor of Pennsylvania. The Board's authority is found in Title 61 P.C.S. §§6102 et seq. A 1965 amendment (Act 501) significantly broadened the Board's powers and duties to include the administration of a Grant-In-Aid Program for the improvement of county adult probation and parole services, the establishment of statewide probation and parole personnel and program standards, the provision of training for county adult probation and parole personnel, and the collection, compilation, and publication of county probation and parole statistical information. Act 501 of 1965 also provides for an Advisory Committee on Probation to assist the Board in formulating and reviewing standards for probation personnel and program services for the counties.

The following County Adult Probation and Parole Statistical Report provides detailed information about county adult probation and parole offenders, personnel, and program services, which will serve as a resource for future program planning. All counts and rates are supplied by the counties and figures are shown as reported by the counties. For those responses that were found to be inconsistent, we updated the responses to "DK" for don't know.

Additionally, Bedford, Blair, Greene, McKean, Northampton, and Potter did not report values for the 2019 report, as a result, their county values are from the last year they reported.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS – OFFENDER

As of December 31, 2019 (Unless otherwise stated, all comparisons are with December 31, 2018):

(Note: Some figures may not add to 100% due to rounding.)

- The number of county adult offenders supervised in-county, 232,706, decreased by 5.8 percent, a decrease of 14,289 offenders, while offenders supervised by the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole (PBPP), 41,347, increased by 0.1 percent, or 42 offenders.
- Offenders supervised by county adult probation and parole departments represented 85.6 percent of the total number of adult offenders under supervision, while offenders supervised by PBPP, represented the remaining 14.4 percent.
- The intermediate punishment offender population, 17,520, increased by 11.8 percent, an increase of 2,074 offenders.
- The number of adult probation officers supervising a caseload, 1,798, increased by 3.9 percent, an increase of 68 adult probation officers.
- The average total in-county caseload was 129 offenders per adult probation officer. The average active caseload was 99 offenders per adult probation officer. The average total caseload in any one county ranged from a low of 23 offenders per probation officer (Cameron County) to a high of 255 offenders per probation officer (Bucks County).
- Of the counties reporting data, 10.7 percent, or 24,969, of the county adult offenders were absconders, a decrease of 2,392 offenders from the previous year.
- Of the counties reporting data, 7,252 county adult offenders were military veterans.
- The county adult offenders had an offense grading for the most serious offense as follows: felony – 30.9 percent; misdemeanor – 50.6 percent; other – 5.8 percent. Data was not available for the remaining offenders.
- Of the 2019 county adult offenders under supervision, 65.7 percent were male, 22.6 percent were female and 11.7 were not identified in the survey.

- Of the county adult offenders under supervision, 59.6 percent were White and 25.5 percent were Black or African American, 11.7 percent were not identified in the survey, while the remaining 3.2 percent fell into other categories. 8.3 percent of the county adult offenders were of known Hispanic ethnicity.
- 2.5 percent of the county adult offenders were under supervision for sexual offenses, 11.5 percent for other violent offenses, 16.1 percent for property offenses, 17.3 percent for drug law violations, 17.6 percent for Driving Under the Influence (D.U.I.), 12.9 percent for other offenses, and 22.1 percent were not known. (Most serious offense, regardless of conviction status)
- During 2019, a total of 151,982 investigations and reports were reported. This was an increase of 9.4 percent, or 13,044 investigations and reports. Pre-parole investigations decreased by 8.9 percent, or 1,625, while pre-sentence reports decreased by 8.7 percent, or 1,928.
- An actuarial instrument was used by 89.8 percent of the reporting adult probation departments to assess adult offender risk/needs. 96.2 percent of those adult probation departments use the instruments to assign caseloads and 94.3 percent conduct reassessments on a regular basis.
- Of the county adult probation and parole departments reporting data for offenders able to work, 55.7 percent were employed.
- 2.4 percent of county adult offenders supervised were sexual offenders. Megan's Law registration was required for 66.7 percent of the sexual offender population.
- All 59 reporting counties, or 100 percent, use electronic monitoring (EM) and/or Global Positioning System (GPS). 12 counties use EM only, 12 counties use GPS only, and 35 counties use both.
- Of the offenders discharged in 2019, 73.7 percent, or 81,584 offenders, were successfully discharged and of those, 4,725 offenders had their supervision terminated early.
- Total revocations were 12.9 percent of total caseload; 4.6 percent for convicted violators and 7.4 percent for technical violators.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS – AGENCIES

- The total county adult probation and parole staff (professional and clerical/support) increased by 2.9 percent, an increase of 75 positions. The professional staff increased by 75 positions and the clerical/support staff remained at the same level, 497.
- For position classifications of PO 3 or higher (361 positions), males held 59.0 percent or 213 of these positions, with the remaining 41.0 percent or 148 positions held by females.
- Specialty Courts: Domestic Violence - 2; Driving Under the Influence - 19; Drug - 38; Mental Health - 23; Re-Entry - 1; Veterans – 25; Job and Other – 17.

FY 2019-20 HIGHLIGHTS – GRANT-IN-AID AND SUPERVISION FEES

- The FY 2019-20 Commonwealth Budget provided a Grant-In-Aid appropriation of \$16,222,000 for the Improvement of Adult Probation Services. The appropriation provided \$16,150,000 to partially fund the salaries of 1,014 adult probation staff and \$72,000 for the training of county adult probation and parole personnel.
- 1,014 incumbent continuing program county adult probation and parole professional staff, with \$58,638,096 in eligible salaries, were funded at 29.7 percent of eligibility.
- An additional 1,193 county adult probation and parole professional staff, with \$55,547,292 in eligible salaries, were not funded due to the unavailability of new program funds in FY 2019-20.
- 151 county adult probation and parole professional staff were ineligible for funding, as these positions represent base year positions (positions that were established prior to the inception of the Grant-In-Aid Program in January 1966).
- Offender supervision fee revenue returned to the counties by the Board during FY 2019-20 totaled \$17,757,659, a decrease of \$890,575 or 4.4 percent.

- If the offender supervision fees returned to the counties each year by the Board and the Grant-In-Aid funds were commingled and applied to the salaries of the 1,014 incumbent continuing program positions and all of the 2,207 eligible positions, these positions would be funded 57.8 percent and 29.7 percent respectively.
- Total offender supervision fees collected by the counties in 2019 was \$32,672,276. Of counties reporting in both 2019 and 2020 this was a decrease of \$666,233 or 2.0 percent.
- During 2019, the monthly offender supervision fee assessment increased in eight counties and decreased in three counties. The average monthly offender supervision fee assessed was \$44 per month.
- Offender supervision fee assessments ranged from \$25 per month to \$75 per month.
- The five counties collecting the most in offender supervision fee revenue in 2019 included: Allegheny County at \$3,821,809; Delaware County at \$1,773,007; Berks County at \$1,618,875; Lehigh County at \$1,576,940; and York County at \$1,542,482.



MAP 2 - AVERAGE ACTIVE CASELOAD



MAP 3 - ABSCONDERS AS % OF TOTAL OFFENDERS



CHART 5 - OFFENSE GRADE 2019



CHART 6 - GENDER OF OFFENDERS 2019



CHARTS 7 and 7A - RACE AND ETHNICITY OF OFFENDERS 2019




CHART 9 - INVESTIGATIONS AND REPORTS 2019



MAP 13 - SEXUAL OFFENDERS WITH INTENSIVE SUPERVISION



MAP 15 - SUCCESSFUL COMPLETIONS AS A PERCENT OF ALL DISCHARGES 2019



CHART 16 - TYPE OF DISCHARGE 2019



CHART 17 - REVOCATIONS 2019






CHART 19 - OFFENDER SUPERVISION COUNTS 2019

MAP 30A - SUPERVISION REFERRALS TO PBPP 2019



CHART 31A - COUNTY ADULT PROBATION AND PAROLE STAFF TEN-YEAR DATA





CHART 31B - IN-COUNTY CASELOAD HISTORY TEN-YEAR DATA

TEN-YEAR DATA**




CHART 31D - PBPP SERVICES TO COUNTIES TEN-YEAR DATA




CHART 31E -GRANT-IN-AID AND SUPERVISION FEES TEN-YEAR DATA




CHART 31F - GRANT-IN-AID SALARIES TEN-YEAR DATA




CHART 31G - GRANT-IN-AID POSITIONS TEN-YEAR DATA
