

SCHOOL SAFETY AND SECURITY ASSESSMENT PROVIDER REGISTRATION CRITERIA

Section <u>1304-B</u> of the PA Public School Code (under Act 44 of 2018) requires the following:

Section 1304-B. School safety and security assessment providers.

- (a) Duty to provide registration.--No later than October 31, 2018, the committee shall establish criteria for registration of a person with knowledge and experience in matters of school safety and security that qualifies the person to conduct school safety and security assessments based upon the criteria established by the committee beginning October 31, 2018.
- (b) Periodic review of criteria.--The committee shall review the criteria established in subsection (a) at a minimum every three years and may make revisions as needed.
- (c) Registration.--The person shall apply for registration as a provider to the committee in a manner prescribed by the committee.

Please note that nothing precludes a school entity from using the assessment criteria to conduct their own assessments. However, for a school entity to be eligible to use School Safety and Security Grant Program funding to pay for items or activities identified in their assessments (which are not part of Level 1 Baseline Criteria), when the school entity has not yet met all Level 1 Baseline Criteria, the physical security assessment must be conducted by either a member of the PA State Police RVAT Unit or a physical security expert included on this registry. Likewise, the behavioral health assessment must be conducted by a behavioral health expert on this registry.

REGISTRATION CRITERIA:

A. Every individual approved for this registry conducting an assessment for a school entity shall meet the following criteria:

- 1. Obtain the following background clearances and certifications:
 - Act 126 Mandated Reporter Training: Recognizing and Reporting Child Abuse
 - Act 34 Pennsylvania Criminal History Record Check
 - Act 151 Pennsylvania Child Abuse History Certification
 - Act 114 Federal Criminal History Record Information (FBI fingerprinting)
- 2. Affirm the following statement:

I have not been arrested for or convicted of any offense as outlined in <u>Section 111</u> (relating to criminal history of employes and prospective employes; conviction of certain offenses) of the Public School Code of 1949, <u>23 Pa.C.S. §6344</u> (relating to employees having contact with children; adoptive and foster parents), or <u>42 Pa.C.S. Chapter 97</u> (Subchapter H) (relating to registration of sex offenders).

B. Every individual approved for this registry conducting Physical Criteria Assessments shall meet <u>at least one</u> of the following qualifications:

- 1. Certified by an accredited organization that provides physical risk and vulnerability assessments and training.
 - Examples of providers are: <u>ASIS International</u>, <u>U.S. Department of Homeland Security</u>, <u>International CPTED Association</u>, <u>PSTP through Federal Law Enforcement Training</u> <u>Centers</u>, etc.
 - Applicant must provide a copy of the certificate and/or any associated documentation.

- 2. Currently serving or served a minimum of one year as a Physical Security Assessor in the Pennsylvania State Police Risk & Vulnerability Assessment Team (RVAT).
- 3. Served as a Physical Security Assessor in a federal law enforcement agency, other state police department, and/or municipal police department physical security assessment unit equivalent to Pennsylvania State Police RVAT for a minimum of two years.
- 4. Served as a School Resource Officer (SRO) or School Police Officer at any K-12 public school entity in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, or any private school in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for a period of 5 years and has completed National Association of School Resource Officers (NASRO) certification or equivalent training.
- 5. Served in the capacity of a physical security assessor in a physical security assessment unit in any branch of the United States armed forces/DOD for a period of two years and carries a certificate in physical security validated by the National Commission for Certifying Agencies.
 - Examples include <u>Department of Defense Intelligence and Security Professional</u>
 <u>Certification programs</u>, <u>Defense Counterintelligence and Security Agency programs</u>, etc.
- 6. As a law enforcement officer or security professional, completed private and/or public school risk and vulnerability assessments and issued written reports containing recommendations for improvements.
 - Applicant must provide a list with dates of at least 10 school buildings in which the
 officer/security professional has completed risk and vulnerability assessments within the
 past 5 years.
- 7. Served as a school entity employee with a minimum of 5 years' experience conducting school risk and vulnerability assessments as part of assigned duties.
- 8. Currently serving or has served with the PA Department of Education (PDE) with at least 5 years' experience relating to new or existing school safety planning or assessment tools.
- 9. Currently serving or has served with a state agency such as the PA Emergency Management Agency (PEMA) with at least 5 years' experience relating to safety and security assessments.
- 10. Currently serving with an architecture firm that specializes in educational facilities with at least 5 years' experience relating to school design/building security and is certified in Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) or an equivalent certification or training.

C. Every individual approved for this registry conducting Student Assistance and Behavioral Health Support Assessments shall meet <u>at least one</u> of the following qualifications:

- 1. PA Department of Education recognized certification in Behavioral Health and the ability to conduct behavioral health assessments that incorporate all the pertinent components identified in the Student Assistance and Behavioral Health Support Assessment Criteria. Example certifications include:
 - School Psychologist
 - School Counselor
 - Licensed Social Worker
 - Licensed Professional Counselor
 - School Administrator with completion of Act 45 PA Inspired Leadership credits in safety and mental health
- 2. Resume and certifications indicating knowledge base and competency to conduct assessments covering each of the following areas, as detailed in the <u>Student Assistance and Behavioral Health Support Assessment Criteria</u>, and a statement confirming review of these criteria and qualification to complete such assessments:
 - Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS)/Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS)
