Canvas Reminders

As a reminder, the completion of all three online subjects: Civil law and Levies, Domestic Violence, and Human Trafficking **must** be completed by **Friday, November 21, 2025**, at 5:00 pm. Failure to complete all 2025 continuing education requirements will result in the expiration of constable certifications at midnight on December 31, 2025. For expired certifications, constables must complete all 2026 Continuing Education requirements to regain certification.

The online subjects can be found at <https://canvas.temple.edu>. When completing each module, ensure that all content plays through in its entirety before advancing to the next slide. Skipping ahead may cause Canvas to incorrectly mark the module as "complete," but the evaluation and exam will remain locked until all material has been reviewed.

To pass each online subject, a minimum score of 70% (7/10) is required. If a passing score is achieved on the first attempt, it will not be necessary to retake the exam. Please note that only the first passing score is recorded in CCETS, even if a subsequent attempt results in a higher score.

2026 Training Schedule

Enrollment for the 2026 training courses begins on Monday, December 15, 2025, at 8:00 AM. To enroll, log into CCETS via the [PCCD CCETS Login](#). Online enrollment is secure, fast, and provides immediate confirmation. Constables can search the training schedule by region and type of training, then select and enroll in a class online. When a class reaches its capacity, the system closes the class and only accepts enrollments on the waiting list. Constables may cancel an existing class enrollment and simultaneously register for a different class. However, the system restricts enrollment to only one class of the same type at any given time. The system builds class rosters and automatically moves the first person from the waiting list to the class roster when another constable cancels an enrollment. All cancellations are tracked by the system.

Weapons Safety Reminder

Pursuant to Act 49, the Constables Education and Training Board (Board) is responsible for maintaining standards for constable training and education. As such, weapon safety remains a priority for both the Program and the Board.

With recent information released related to the Sig Sauer P320, we would like to remind constables and deputy constables, regardless of what make of duty weapon is used, to remain vigilant and adhere to the following weapon safety and maintenance reminders:

- Periodically double check your weapon systems and manufacturer updates/upgrades, or those purchased with updates/ upgrades installed.
- Periodically check/double check equipment and review manufacturer manuals for safety practices.
- Inspect holsters regularly to ensure proper function, paying close attention to signs of wear, cracking, or foreign objects.
- Stay current with reliable resources for further important safety information.
- Consider replacing any equipment that exhibits significant wear, malfunctions, or poses a potential obstruction when drawing your weapon.

These reminders also apply to non-lethal tools and other duty gear used in your daily work-related operations.
