Dog Law Report

Pennsylvania General Assembly
Act 225 of 1982, as amended by Act 119 of 2008

MARCH 2023

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Overview

Act 225 of 1982, as amended by Act 119 of 2008, charged the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture with enforcing the commonwealth’s Dog Law.

The Bureau of Dog Law Enforcement (“BDLE”), under the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture (“Department”), enforces all Dog Law-related regulations, including licensing

individual dogs, licensing and inspecting kennels, humanely capturing dogs found running at large and placing them in shelters, investigating dangerous dog incidents, enforcing safety measures for dogs deemed dangerous, investigating and prosecuting illegal kennel operations, and processing claims for livestock damage that dogs and coyotes cause.

As required by Section 906 of the Dog Law, this report to the General Assembly provides:

Dog Licenses

County treasurers and agents sell dog licenses to Pennsylvania residents. The current cost of an annual dog license is \$6.50 for altered dogs, \$8.50 for unaltered dogs and \$31.50 for a lifetime license for altered dogs and \$51.50 for a lifetime license for unaltered dogs. These fees are set in statute and have not been increased in over 27 years. Revenue from the sale of annual and lifetime licenses are directed to the Dog Law Restricted Account. In accordance with the Dog Law, Philadelphia County and the cities of Altoona, Erie, Harrisburg, Pittsburgh, and Scranton administer their own dog license sales, retain all income and information generated, and do not report dog licensing sales income to the department (reference Appendix J for Section 1201 of the Dog Law, which addresses enforcement by independent political subdivisions). While this report does not include sales or revenue generated within those cities, it is important to note that the fees are significantly higher in those cities ranging from \$6 to \$40 for annual licenses, and \$30 to \$175 for a lifetime or a 12-year license. Without a statewide BDLE, more counties or municipalities would have to charge significantly higher fees to provide these services at the local level. Legislation that includes a modest dog license fee increase is the only solution to ensure the department can meet its statutory obligations and protect Pennsylvania's dogs.

There were 736,188 individual dog licenses sold in 2022, including 682,192 annual and 53,996 lifetime licenses, generating \$5,106,096 in revenue (Appendix C).

The total number of dog licenses sold, decreased by 9 percent, and the total license sales revenue decreased by 8 percent from license year 2021 to 2022. BDLE's current financial crisis and lack of adequate funding, is directly related to poor license sales. Without staff available to canvass, follow-up on individuals who have not renewed their licenses, and having a strong presence in the community and at community events, license sales will continue to drop or remain stagnant. Without a license fee increase to fill necessary vacancies it will be nearly impossible for BDLE to increase license sales. In addition to a fee increase, licensing education is crucial. By lowering the dog licensing requirement to the age a dog can legally be transferred

to a new owner (eight weeks) or three months whichever comes first, dog licensing compliance will increase.

Kennel Licenses

BDLE licensed 2,828 kennels in Pennsylvania in 2022, garnering \$548,450 in license fees directed to BDLE's restricted account (Appendix D).

Kennel license revenue increased by 3.2 percent and the total number of kennels increased another .6 percent from calendar year 2021. The kennels (in-state) requiring inspections continue to increase annually, yet there has been no fee increase to help accommodate staffing and resource shortages. Licensed kennel stakeholder groups have emphasized that they are willing to pay an increase in their licensing fees to ensure quality inspections from dog wardens continue. There were 732 in-state kennels or 26 percent of all kennels requiring an inspection located in counties without a dedicated dog warden in 2022.

The total number of licensed kennels increased by 32 percent and the number of commercially licensed kennels increased 130 percent since 2011, when the more stringent regulations for commercial kennels went into effect. Each year the number of licensed commercial kennels increases. This year saw a 14 percent increase over calendar year 2021. The steady growth in the number of commercially licensed kennels can be attributed to BDLE enforcement efforts as well as educational partnerships with the PA Professional Pet Breeders Association and the PAWS organization.

The number of in-state kennels requiring inspection continues to increase annually yet there has been no fee increase to help accommodate staffing and resource shortages. Kennel fees have not been increased since 1965 with the small exception of the addition of the Class VI license in 2008, costing \$750 for 501 or more dogs in a calendar year.

Out-of-State Dealers

In 2022, 138 out-of-state dealers were licensed, generating \$16,000 in revenue for the restricted account (Appendix E).

Dog Law Inspections

A total of 5,924 kennel inspections were completed in 2022 (Appendix F). This is a slight decrease of 0.3 percent compared to 2021.

Although small, the decrease in the number of inspections conducted compared to the previous year is alarming considering in 2022 BDLE saw an increase in the number of licensed kennels. Due to staffing issues, most kennels requiring a follow-up inspection were deferred until 2023, to fulfill the requirement to inspect all kennels twice in 2022. It is concerning that kennels with poor conditions did not receive proper timely follow-up as yet another consequence of BDLE not being fully staffed and funded.

Thirty-eight percent of all inspections conducted occurred in region 7 which is located in southeast PA. This is significant because dog wardens from other parts of the state had to travel to Lancaster County to inspect kennels, severely limiting their ability to provide dog law services

in their assigned counties. This is a direct result of not increasing licensing fees which are BDLE's primary source of revenue.

Enforcement Activities

BDLE refused or revoked ten kennel licenses/applications in 2022; an increase of 43 percent from calendar year 2021.

Thirty-nine citations were issued for operating a kennel without a license in 2022; a decrease of 17 percent from calendar year 2021.

In 2022, BDLE collected \$29,000 through administrative actions (settlements and civil penalties) and \$100,155 in Dangerous Dog registration fees.

Citation Issuance

In 2022, BDLE issued 2,402 summary citations and 130 misdemeanor complaints for kennel and other Dog Law violations, including, but not limited to, failure to license, dogs running at large or abandoned, and dangerous dogs (Appendix H).

Since Fiscal Year 1998-99, 75% of the fines and penalties revenue collected by BDLE has been diverted to the Judicial Computer System Fund. Of the approximately \$275,000 collected in fines and penalties each fiscal year only \$70,000 is retained in the Dog Law Fund.

In 2022, \$198,952 or 75% of the total fines and penalties BDLE collected was transferred out of the Dog Law Restricted Account and deposited into the Judicial Computer System Account. Since 1998 a total of \$5,238,686 has been transferred out of the Dog Law fund in accordance with Act 64. This annual reduction of fines and penalties revenue is a contributing factor to the fund's solvency issues. Increasing revenue generated through fines and penalties collected have no positive impact on the Dog Law Fund. At the end of 2022 the balance in the Judicial Computer System Fund was \$8.4 million while the Dog Law Fund has a balance of only \$641,457 and is now requiring support from the Department's General Fund. Filing more citations will not resolve BDLE's insolvency.

Citations issued increased by 4.5 percent compared to calendar year 2021. This increase was expected, as BDLE is still feeling the impact of the abundance of dogs sold and adopted during the COVID-19 pandemic. If BDLE were operating at full capacity and able to provide adequate oversight to kennels to ensure high standards of care, the number of citations filed might be much higher.

Dogs Seized and Impounded and Total Reimbursements

BDLE plays a critical role in managing stray dogs by assisting with the humane capture and transport of dogs to shelters. Shelters and municipalities receive payments to help cover the costs associated with transporting, feeding, and caring for stray dogs. BDLE paid \$7,795 for 1,559 dogs statewide (Appendix I). Since January 1, 2021, the reimbursement rate per dog has been the minimum required by regulation of \$5; this is due to BDLE's insufficient funds.

Dog Law Restricted Account – Revenue and Expenditures for Calendar Year 2022

All BDLE activities are funded by a restricted account. All revenue and expenses related to BDLE are credited and disbursed from the Dog Law Restricted Account as required by Section 1001 of the Dog Law.

**Act 64 – Transfer to Judicial Computer System Account:*

In 2022, \$198,952, or 75% of the total fines and penalties BDLE collected was transferred out of the Dog Law Restricted Account and into the Judicial Computer System Account. Since 1998, a total of \$5,238,686 has been transferred out of the Dog Law fund in accordance with Act 64. This annual reduction of fines and penalties revenue is another contributing factor to the fund's solvency issues.

***GGO Support:*

To prevent the Dog Law Restricted Fund from going negative in 2022, \$2,938,000 in Administrative Overhead expenses were transferred out and changed to the department's GGO waiver funding.

Licensing Fees

The primary source of revenue for the Dog Law Restricted Account is the sale of individual dog licenses. This is supplemented by kennel licenses and fines that are capped at approximately \$70,000 annually. Individual dog license sales generated approximately \$5.1 million in 2022.

Looming Concerns

Pennsylvania dog license fees have been the exact same cost since 1996.

The focus of BDLE in 2022 was to restore the solvency of the Dog Law Restricted Account. Unfortunately, without the passage of critical legislation to modernize and fully fund the BDLE, it was a struggle to meet bare minimum statutory requirements and maintain a healthy productive workplace.

Since its enactment in 1893, the enforcement of the Dog Law has been funded through the sale of dog licenses. Dog licensing was created to hold individual dog owners responsible for damages when their dogs got loose and attacked farmers' livestock. The revenue raised from dog license dollars also provided reimbursement to farmers whose livestock was attacked by coyotes.

As a direct result of the inaction to fully fund BDLE, the department now must provide support from the general operating fund. These general operating funds would otherwise be earmarked for other statutory and regulatory priorities of the department.

BDLE relied on a transfer of funds of \$2.938 million from the department in calendar year 2022 in order to maintain the current level of statutory obligations. Even with department dollars BDLE cannot fill critical vacancies. This is a stop-gap measure, only allowing the bureau to continue operating at **status quo**.

Status quo is not enough. So much has changed and evolved since 1893, and the Dog Law is no exception. There are more residents (nearly 11 million), and more dogs (more than 3 million), excluding Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, Scranton, Erie, Altoona, and Harrisburg, the cities that handle their own licensing and dog control. With the increase in population and number of dog owners comes an increase in dog-related incidents and more kennels to fill supply and demand.

If the COVID-19 pandemic has taught us anything, it is that people rely on dogs for companionship. While many industries were negatively impacted, the dog breeding and adoption industries created an even larger supply shortage which is why the number of licensed kennels has continued to grow.

While the dog license fee has remained the same for 27 years, BDLE's operational costs continue to climb and have led to today's current deficit. Since 1996, personnel costs have more than doubled, with an increase of 125%, despite reduced staffing levels and not filling mission critical vacancies. Operating costs have more than doubled, increasing by 221%. There is a clear discrepancy regarding BDLE's primary revenue stream (dog licenses) and the increased costs associated with fulfilling BDLE's statutory requirements.

Since 1996, priorities for BDLE have changed. With licensed kennels increasing in numbers by nearly 20% and some of the strictest kennel standards in the nation as of 2008, BDLE spends more time and resources to keep Pennsylvania's nearly 3,000 breeding operations up to par for the dogs who spend their lives there. Since 1996, the total number of kennel inspections has increased by 88%.

While BDLE is clearly doing more with less, it is only a matter of time until the good work of the past years slips away. Pennsylvania will reclaim its title as Puppy Mill Capitol of the East. There will be more outbreaks of infectious and contagious diseases for both dogs and people, and more people become victims of a dangerous dog attack due to lack of monitoring.



Grim Outlook

Without licensing fee increases, department dollars will continue to be necessary to allow for BDLE to continue protecting the safety and welfare of dogs in the commonwealth, as well as human health as it relates to dog attacks and containing infectious and contagious diseases. The loss of BDLE and the services provided is the most immediate threat to the welfare of dogs in Pennsylvania.

Who is impacted by the insufficient funding of BDLE?

Local Government & Law Enforcement: Counties or municipalities will face an impossible decision: raise revenue to cover these vital services, which will likely cost more to the taxpayer to administer duplicative programs than a statewide program, or even worse, to not provide the services at all.

The burden of stray dogs, increased cruelty referrals, more frequent infectious and contagious disease outbreaks, and increased dog bite incidents will unfairly fall on law enforcement who are continually asked to do more with less. Local and state police are already handling more and more Dog Law related complaints in counties with no dedicated dog warden and in areas where the local warden is not available because they were sent to other counties and parts of the state to assist with inspections. There are only 39 dog wardens covering 67 counties, and 48 field staff total, including the dog wardens, 2 kennel compliance specialists, 6 regional supervisors, and the dog law veterinarian. The Dog Law calls that the Pennsylvania State Police (PSP) handle have risen annually over the last three years. PSP has seen a 6% increase in the number of Dog Law calls responded to since 2020.



Dogs Living in Breeding Operations: As the only agency in the state that can inspect state licensed kennels without a search warrant, BDLE has a vital responsibility and duty to ensure the safety and welfare of dogs in kennels.

Often, when you hear about dogs being seized from a kennel, it was due to a dog warden making a cruelty referral to a humane society police officer or police officer after a routine inspection or investigating a complaint.

Kennel inspections provide an opportunity for wardens to ensure proper living conditions and check on the overall well-being of the dogs that live there. All wardens receive humane society police officer training in order to arm them with the knowledge they need to make quality cruelty referrals when necessary.

Dog wardens ensure kennel owners are held accountable for maintaining adequate living conditions for the dogs and puppies and strive to ensure Pennsylvania's dog breeding industry maintains high standards of care and continue to improve the image of the dog breeding industry.

- As a small business, kennel operators rely on quality inspections and reports to show consumers their kennel is a good place to buy a puppy or adopt a dog.
- When you read the headlines in the news about dogs being seized for poor health and horrific living conditions, often it is from an illegal kennel operation.
- Illegal kennels or underground kennel operations, notoriously known as "puppy mills," expose the public to risk of buying sick dogs. This causes heartbreak and costly veterinary bills for those who buy dogs from these unscrupulous businesses and risks spreading disease among other dogs in Pennsylvania.

Pennsylvanians at Large: From tracking and monitoring all of the dangerous dogs in the state, to investigating dog bites to bring justice to victims, and ensuring new puppy owners do not experience the heartache of a sudden death, or lifelong health problems related to improper breeding or veterinary care of the dog, Pennsylvania's dog wardens work every day to protect Pennsylvanians and their furry best friends.


Strays – Dog wardens pick up and transport stray dogs to shelters. Shelters receive money from BDLE for taking in and holding stray dogs. Prior to 2021, shelters were eligible to be reimbursed \$40 for holding a stray dog placed by BDLE. Due to insufficient funds, this reimbursement has been lowered from \$40 to \$5, the minimum required by regulation.

Dangerous Dogs – BDLE is solely responsible for the maintenance of a statewide Dangerous Dog Registry. Any dog that attacks a person or domestic animal and is deemed dangerous in court requires follow-up and registration for the remainder of the dog’s life. This is one of the most important duties of BDLE, as it helps ensure the safety of everyone who lives in or travels through the state. The number of dangerous dogs on the registry increased 11% over 2021. The increase in dangerous dogs is directly related to the increase in dog ownership from 2020 and 2021. This is an effect of the COVID-19 pandemic.

There were several vicious dog attacks in 2022 causing severe injury, and several cases involving a dog previously deemed dangerous attacking again. These violations are misdemeanors of the first or second degree, the highest-level charges in the Dog Law. The law requires the forfeiture of the attacking dog, pending any appeals, then humane euthanasia. But while dog wardens and police are obligated to seize these dogs, licensed kennels and shelters are under no obligation to hold them. It is nearly impossible to find a kennel willing to take on liability to house and care for a dangerous dog pending court proceedings without compensation. The Dog Law specifically notes that payment for the housing and care are the responsibility of the dog owner; however, there is nothing in the Dog Law to hold dog owners accountable for actually paying the facility in advance. The result is that dog wardens and police are left with no option but to leave the dog in the community until the court case is resolved. This exposes individuals and communities to extreme risk. Legislation is needed to require dog owners who file an appeal to secure a licensed kennel to hold the dog and pay any required fees for housing and caring for the dog, with any breach of contract resulting in the humane euthanasia of the dog. Although police can handle an initial dangerous dog case, it is the dog warden who follows up with registration, subsequent inspections twice a year, and updates to the data in the registry.

Appendix J – Section 1201 of the Dog Law
Addressing Enforcement by Independent Political Subdivisions

ARTICLE XII

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 1201. Applicability to cities of the first class, second class, second class A and third class.

(a) Cities of the first class, second class and second class

A.— Insofar as this act provides for the individual licensing of dogs and the payment of damages for domestic animals injured by dogs or for licensed dogs illegally killed, it shall not apply to cities of the first class, second class and second class A. Such individual dog licensing and payment of damages in cities of the first class, second class and second class A shall continue to be carried on under the provisions of existing laws.

(b) Cities of the third class — Insofar as this act provides for the individual licensing of dogs by the department, the payment of damages by the department for domestic animals injured by dogs or for licensed dogs illegally killed and for the performance of duties and functions of dog law enforcement by the department under Articles I and II, except sections 206, 207, 209, 211 and 218 as it pertains to kennel inspections; Article III, except section 301; Articles V through IX; this article; Articles XI and XII, the foregoing responsibilities shall not apply to the department within a city of the third class that does both of the following:

(1) Adopts its own dog licensing ordinance establishing individual dog licensure on a calendar year basis or on another basis consistent with that in use by the department.

(2) Notifies the secretary, in writing, of its intention to assume responsibility for enforcement of its dog licensing ordinance under authority of this section for a period commencing January 1 of a particular year, and not ending prior to December 31 of the year in which the city of the third class terminates its responsibility for enforcement. If the department changes dog licensure from calendar year basis to some other basis by regulation promulgated under authority of section 201, it may modify the requirement set forth in this paragraph to provide for the efficient and equitable transfer of dog law enforcement responsibility and appropriate dog license fees from the city of the third class to the department.
