What is REAP?

Pennsylvania's REAP program helps farmers and landowners implement water quality conservation practices by providing Pennsylvania tax credits for 50%, 75%, or in certain cases 90% of out-of-pocket expenses.

Farmers and landowners in Pennsylvania can use REAP funding to help implement best management practices (BMPs) and purchase no-till equipment.

REAP tax credits help fund projects like:

- No-till planting equipment
- Ag E & S and Nutrient Management Plans
- Animal concentration areas
- Manure storages
- Cover crops
- Riparian buffers
- Grazing infrastructure

Offset costs associated with implementing conservation BMPs, including:

- Contracting
- Materials
- Labor
- Owner/Operator labor



Use REAP tax credits toward your PA income taxes. You can use credits in increments for 15 years, or sell credits.

REAP is a first-come, first-served program - no rankings. To be eligible, applicants must have a current:

- Agricultural Erosion and Sedimentation Plan
- Act 38 Nutrient Management Plan (if required by Pennsylvania Law)
- Manure Management Plan (if needed)

How Non-Farm Businesses Can Participate in REAP:

- Banks and businesses can earn REAP tax credits by sponsoring eligible BMP projects on farms in their community
- REAP tax credits can also be purchased from farmers
