

Quick Guide to Basic Interview Preparation

News Value Factors	Likely Questions	Possible Positive Points
Impact	<i>How many people or groups affected? What's the impact/effect on other operations? What's the cost?</i>	Steps taken to minimize impact
Timeliness	<i>When did it happen? When did you find out? When did you do something about it?</i>	Quick response, good training
Prominence	<i>Anyone prominent involved? Anyone prominent injured? Prominent suspects/victims? What's his or her role</i>	We treat everyone equally
Proximity	<i>Where did it happen? Where are the victims/survivors from? Any local sources/local involvement?</i>	Concern for various local "publics" (Varies by location)
Oddity	<i>Has this ever happened before? What are the odds of such an incident/ accident/occurrence?</i>	Talk about lessons learned or how your plan minimized impact.
Suspense	<i>What will happen next? Anyone in trouble or facing disciplinary action? When will you know the cause?</i>	Talk about actions you're taking.
Conflict	<i>How do you answer the charges made by _____? Do you think this is really fair to _____?</i>	Explain why you're doing what you're doing.
Emotion/ Victims	<i>Any women, children or elderly involved? What are you doing to help the victims?</i>	Say what you're doing to help.
Sex	<i>Were there any women involved? What is the nature of their relationship?</i>	Protect individual privacy. Treat men and women equally.
