

landscape filled with wildlife, history, and small-town charm. Building on this momentum, \$2.1 million in new funding is now available to expand and improve ATV and snowmobile trails statewide. Meanwhile, when a dairy processing facility in New York temporarily paused operations, millions of pounds of milk were rerouted to Pennsylvania processors. Because of rapid coordination between PennDOT, agriculture agencies, and industry partners, necessary permits were issued within 24 hours — preventing waste and keeping shelves stocked.
