Low Carbon Transportation Materials Program

The <u>Low Carbon Transportation Materials (LCTM)</u>

<u>Program</u> aims to reduce pollution by using low-carbon construction materials in projects. This program will promote technology transfer and workforce development and encourage the development of effective systems for identifying these low-carbon materials. State Department of Transportation agencies are not eligible for this funding.
