

Final Paving This Summer to Complete Improvements at Five Points Intersection in Montgomeryville

Summer 2026 – Final paving is underway this summer at the Five Points Intersection in Montgomeryville, substantially completing the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation's (PennDOT) project to improve travel and safety at the sprawling intersection of Route 309 (Bethlehem Pike), Route 463 (Horsham Road/Cowpath Road), and Business U.S. 202 (Doylestown Road) Intersection, in Montgomery Township, Montgomery County.



The \$14.2 million project has created additional through lanes along with turn lanes in both directions on Route 309 and Route 463 (Cowpath Road/Horsham Road), and on Business U.S. 202 (Doylestown Road) at the intersection. New curbs and sidewalks also were installed through the intersection.

Final milling and placement of the final overlay for the entire project is expected to finish in August. This paving work is being performed Sunday through Thursday nights under a full detour of the project limits.

Paving adjustments for driveways and utility adjustments will take place during the day with periodic lane closures and temporary traffic patterns at those adjustment locations.



Plantings in stormwater detention areas have been completed.

Other improvements include upgrading and retiming signalization; installing sidewalks, ADA curb ramps, and guiderail; upgrading stormwater drainage, signage, and pavement markings; adjusting driveway access; and reducing erosion sediment.

Work on the project began in early 2024.

Road-Con, Inc. of West Chester, Chester County, is the general contractor on this project, which is financed with 100 percent federal funds.
