

THE BOULEVARD TOMORROW: SAFETY UPGRADES AT 9TH STREET

Overview

The City of Philadelphia, PennDOT, and SEPTA are making near-term improvements along Roosevelt Boulevard. These upgrades are part of the Boulevard Tomorrow (2024–2031) phase of the Route for Change program.

Project Goals

- Safer streets for everyone
- Easier pedestrian crossings
- Smoother traffic flow
- Stronger neighborhood connections

As part of the larger Roosevelt Boulevard Tomorrow improvements, changes are planned at the 9th Street intersection, including:

- Intersection realignment to reduce crashes and driver confusion
- Straighter, shorter pedestrian crossings with added safety features and ADA upgrades—cutting crossing length by about 150 feet
- Updated traffic signal timings so pedestrians have more time to cross the Boulevard with each green light
- Improved street lighting to increase visibility and safety at night
- A safety-focused design that balances the needs of people walking, driving, biking, and riding transit

Approximate Construction Timeline:

2024-2026: Preliminary Engineering

2027-2028: Final Design

2029-2031: Construction
