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Section 1. Introduction

A. Purpose of this Document

This document serves as a supplement to the National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) Community Charging Funding Opportunity Round 4 – Eastern Region, available on [PennDOT's NEVI Community Charging webpage](#). Specifically, this document details the process PennDOT and its partners employed to develop electric vehicle (EV) charging use case rankings and list of priority communities that are utilized in incentivizing and scoring Proposals for the NEVI Community Charging Funding Opportunity Round 4 – Eastern Region.

For the eastern region, the aggregate EV charging priority use cases and priority eligible locations were developed in partnership with the Planning Partners listed in **Table 1**. In turn, the Planning Partners integrated feedback from the stakeholders in their county(ies). B. NEVI Formula Program Overview

The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) established the NEVI formula program to fund EV charging infrastructure nationwide. Through this program, Pennsylvania is receiving \$171.5 million to support the expansion of access to charging stations across the Commonwealth.

After advancing the Alternative Fuel Corridor (AFC) charging network with over 80 awarded stations, Pennsylvania received *fully built out* certification from the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) in September 2025. The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) is now focusing on growing the EV charging network through three focus areas: corridor connections, community charging, and critical investments, in accordance with the [2025 PA NEVI Plan](#).

C. NEVI Community Charging Regions

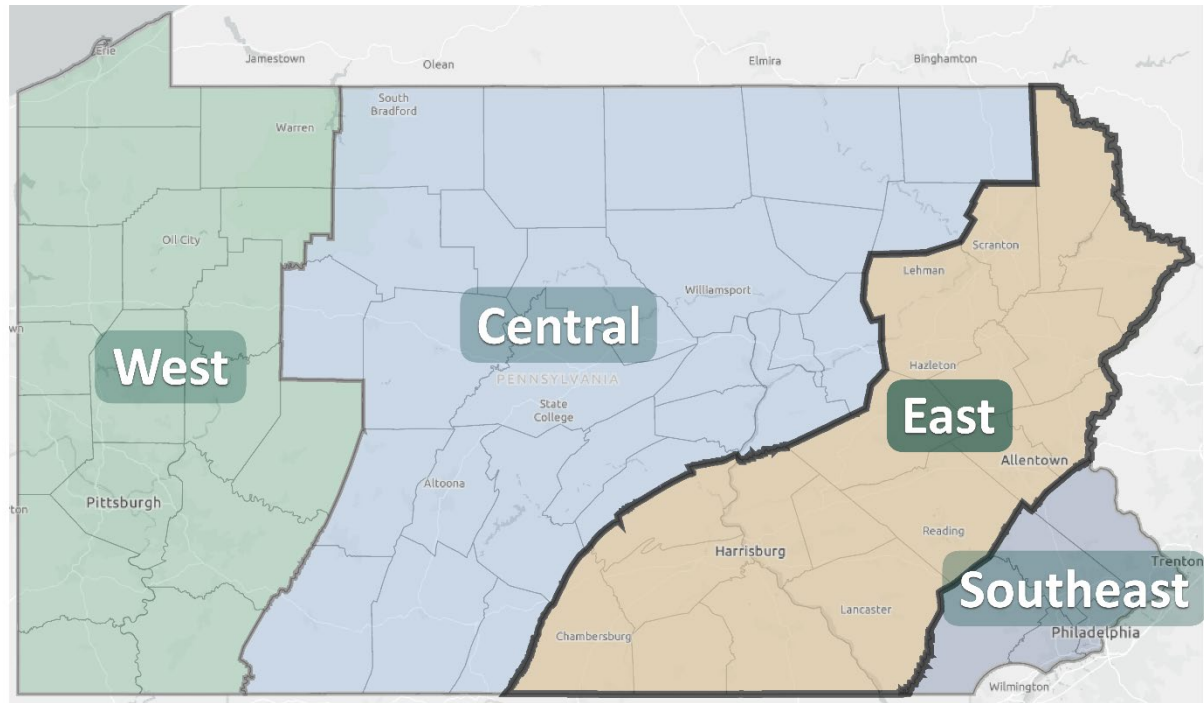


Figure 1. NEVI Community Charging Funding Regions Highlighting Eastern Region

The community charging focus area includes four regional funding opportunities, which are for southeastern, eastern, central, and western PA as shown in **Figure 1**. This document outlines the regional prioritization strategy for the NEVI Community Charging Funding Opportunity Round 4 – Eastern Region.

Section 2. NEVI Community Charging Use Case and Location Prioritization Process

A. Planning Partner Collaboration

PennDOT aims to ensure all communities have input in the types and locations of charging stations that will best support their own unique needs and usage as part of the NEVI Community Charging Funding Opportunities. In October 2024, PennDOT provided guidance to Pennsylvania's 24 Planning Partners (seven regional Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs), 13 county MPOs¹, and four Rural Planning Organizations (RPOs)), requesting feedback on public EV charging station priorities. This led to the Planning Partners developing EV charging use case rankings and a list of priority communities to support community EV charging for their region.

B. Planned Regional Funding

The planned funding percentages and amounts for each regional NEVI Community Charging Funding Opportunity are shown in **Table 2**. The funding percentages were calculated at the county level and were primarily based on total population. These values are approximate and subject to change at PennDOT's discretion after reviewing the submitted Proposals following the NEVI Community Charging Funding Opportunity in this region. PennDOT is planning to invest a total of approximately \$108 million in Projects awarded via the regional NEVI Community Charging Funding Opportunities.

¹ Includes Wayne County, which is included on [PennDOT's planning website](#) and is responsible for one of the 24 Pennsylvania transportation improvement programs, but does not operate as an MPO. PennDOT Central Office will coordinate with PennDOT District 4 for Wayne County planning regarding the development of EV charging priorities.

C. Program Structure

Each regional NEVI Community Charging Funding Opportunity will follow a similar structure and scoring process, but each region will vary by prioritization of locations and charging use cases as identified by the Planning Partners within the region. For all regional NEVI Community Charging Funding Opportunities, 7% of a proposed Project's final score will be based on its alignment with the prioritized charging use cases and 7% of a proposed Project's final score will be based on whether the Candidate Site is within a priority eligible location or not. An additional 7% of a proposed Project's final score will be based on the Community Needs Score of the Project location.

A detailed scoring rubric is included within each NEVI Community Charging Funding Opportunity.

Community Charging Eligible Locations

All publicly available locations within a region are eligible to apply for funding to build a charging station through the NEVI Community Charging Funding Opportunities. This is a significant change from previous PennDOT NEVI funding opportunities where only specific areas were included as eligible locations. Based on regional priorities and Planning Partner input, some use cases and locations are prioritized as discussed in the following subsections.

Community Charging Use Case Rankings

The guidance document PennDOT provided to the Planning Partners included a sample list of EV charging use cases, such as on-street charging in downtowns, multi-unit dwellings, shopping centers and retail locations, tourism/entertainment venues, convenience store locations, grocery store locations, publicly accessible workplace charging, and others. PennDOT requested that Planning Partners submit a ranking of their highest priority charging use cases.



List of Priority Communities

PennDOT also requested that Planning Partners submit a list of priority communities. PennDOT asked Planning partners to be as specific as possible, while still allowing the opportunity for competition. For example, zip codes, municipalities, neighborhoods, and city blocks are all examples of allowed priority communities, while a specific address or complex is not. With this information from the Planning Partners, PennDOT identified priority eligible locations that highlight areas where charging needs have been most clearly identified through regional and local planning efforts. All areas outside of priority eligible locations within the region are considered eligible locations and Charging Stations in these eligible locations are still encouraged.

Community Needs Score

Each proposed Project will also receive a Community Needs Score based on various characteristics of the census tract. See the NEVI Community Charging Funding Opportunity Round 4 – Eastern Region for more information about scoring and the Community Needs Score.

D. Coordination Procedure with Planning Partners

PennDOT actively coordinated with Planning Partners in the region to develop and refine the final priority use cases and priority eligible locations to be used in the NEVI Community Charging Funding Opportunity Round 4 – Eastern Region.

Coordination began in fall 2024 with PennDOT sharing the Planning Partner Guidance Document and requesting Planning Partners to develop EV charging use case rankings and a list of priority communities focused on community charging needs through coordination with their local governments, community members, and other local stakeholders.

The following describes the process PennDOT used to coordinate with Planning Partners in the region to develop and refine the EV charging priorities:

- PennDOT provided EV charging resources to the Planning Partners.
- The Planning Partners used information from PennDOT resources, community engagement, stakeholder feedback, available data sources, and knowledge of the region to develop EV charging priorities.
- PennDOT reviewed the submitted Planning Partner priorities and responded with any initial or major comments (i.e., specific sites or addresses are not allowed, etc.).
- The Planning Partners performed edits to the lists as needed.
- PennDOT mapped the provided priority communities creating draft priority eligible locations for EV charging, and shared an interactive map of the locations with each Planning Partner.
- The Planning Partners provided detailed comments on the mapped priority eligible locations.
- PennDOT refined the mapped priority eligible locations as requested.
- PennDOT aggregated the regional EV charging use case rankings after all Planning Partners' submissions for the region were received.



E. PennDOT Developed Priorities

For Planning Partners that did not provide complete EV charging priority communities, PennDOT developed priority eligible locations based on a default prioritization process. This process was designed to fill information gaps in areas where Planning Partners did not provide a full response, ensure these areas are represented in the regional prioritization process, and generate priorities to use as part of the NEVI Community Charging Funding Opportunity.

For the eastern region, PennDOT did not receive priority communities from three Planning Partners within the region and thus followed this process for the NEVI Community Charging Funding Opportunity Round 4 – Eastern Region for the following Planning Partners:

- Franklin County MPO
- Lebanon County MPO
- Wayne County

Summary of PennDOT Developed Priority Process

PennDOT uses a repeatable workflow that balances community needs, charging gaps, and geographic coverage, which is summarized below:

- Screen candidate communities and activity centers (e.g., towns/boroughs, higher-density areas, parks, and other destinations)
- Identify candidate travel routes that support local and regional connectivity, as applicable
- Use available datasets (NEVI funded stations, existing public charging, EV registrations, and community needs indicators) to identify gaps and prioritize areas of greatest benefit
- Map priority locations as community- or corridor-based areas (not site-specific addresses) and distribute them across the county to avoid over-concentration

PennDOT-Developed Priority Locations Methodology

PennDOT used the following step-by-step process to identify candidate municipalities and corridors, narrowed the set based on data and engineering judgment, and produced a final mapped set of priority areas suitable for inclusion in the NEVI Community Charging interactive map and funding opportunity materials

- Step 1. Assemble datasets
- Step 2. Perform origin-destination analysis for all census tracts
- Step 3. Analyze data to produce EV charging priority maps
- Step 4. Narrow to preliminary priority sites list, and review for any gaps in the region
- Step 5. Calibrate the number of priority areas to expected project volume range
- Step 6. Draft the mapped priority areas (polygons and corridor buffers)
- Step 7. Verify that outputs mirror Planning Partner formats
- Step 8. Conduct stakeholder review and refine
- Step 9. Finalize and publish

Section 3. Regional Prioritization for NEVI Community Charging Round 4 – Eastern Region

A. Collaboration and Coordination with Planning Partners – Eastern Region

In the eastern region, HATS MPO, LLTS MPO, LANCO MPO, LVTS MPO, NEPA MPO, RATS MPO, and YAMPO each submitted a list of priority communities and EV charging use case rankings. FCMPO, LEBCO MPO, and Wayne County did not submit a list of priority communities or EV charging use case rankings. ACTPO submitted a list of priority communities but not EV charging use case rankings. Planning Partners compiled this information using direct coordination with the local stakeholders in the county(ies) that they serve.

PennDOT used the information provided to draft the eastern region's charging priorities. This information was validated with the Planning Partners before finalizing the NEVI Community Charging Funding Opportunity for the region.

B. Program Funding – Eastern Region

Total NEVI funding for the eastern region is planned to be approximately \$33 million through the community charging focus area. The planned funding amounts per county are shown in **Table 3**. Planning Partner regions and counties may receive total funding awards outside the planned funding range shown for a variety of reasons. For example, a Planning Partner region or county may receive a higher total funding award if necessary to award a single Project, or it may receive a lower total funding award if few Proposals are received within the geographic area.

The percentages shown in **Table 3** are based upon total funding planned for all Community Charging Funding Opportunities, which is approximately \$108 million.

C. Community Charging Use Case Priority Levels – Eastern Region

Each regional NEVI Community Charging Funding Opportunity includes aggregated community charging use cases and aggregated priority levels (very high, high, moderate, and not prioritized) that are used when scoring proposed Projects.

Table 4 displays the final use case rankings submitted by Planning Partners within the eastern region, which were used to derive the aggregate priority level for each use case. For the Planning Partner submissions, values were normalized to a 1-5 scale, where “1” was the highest priority. A single high ranking from one Planning Partner can bring up the aggregate priority level, however, it does not guarantee that the use case will be rated highly. If a planning partner did not submit use cases, they were not scored. Note that the use case priorities were then weighted based on the amount of funding planned for each Planning Partner’s county(ies) in order to develop the aggregate priority levels.

Each location has a unique identifier in the form: XXXYYY, where XXX is the county code and YYY is the unique location number. The county codes for the eastern region are shown in **Table 5**.

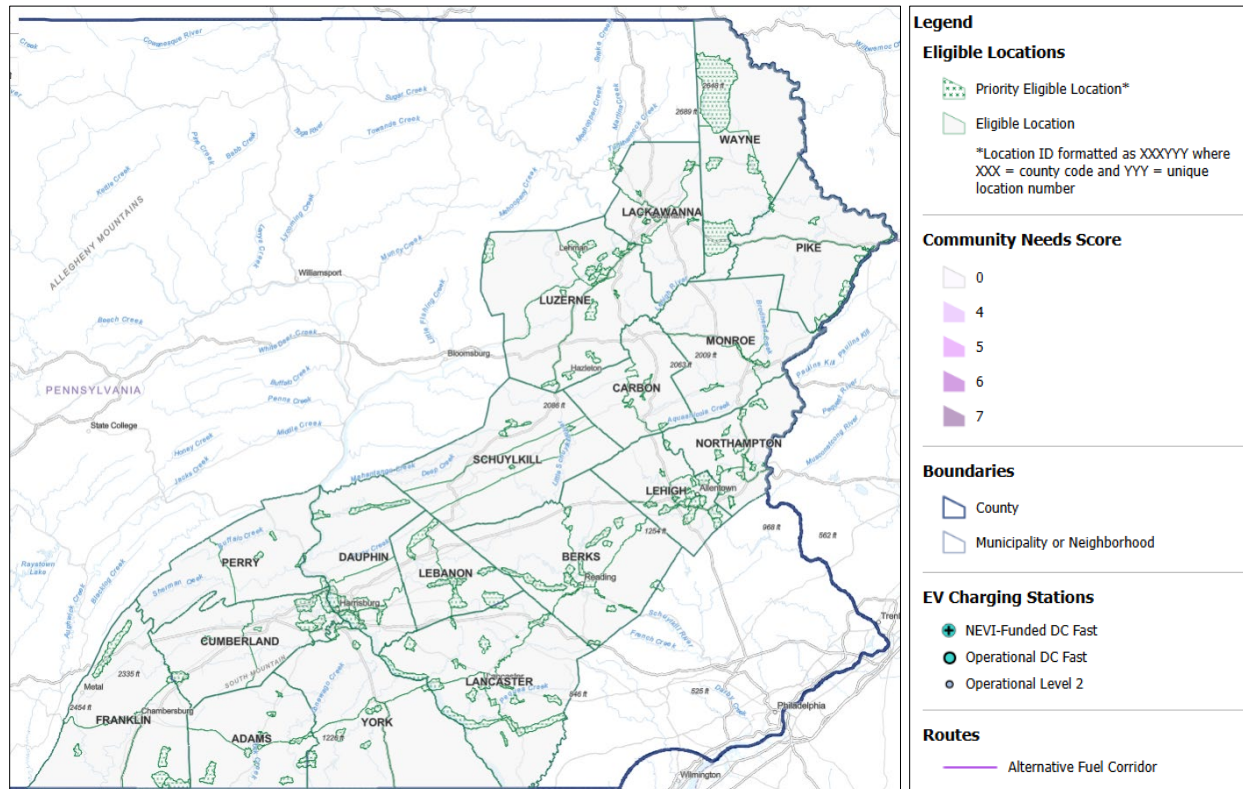


Figure 2. Screenshot of the NEVI Community Charging Interactive Map – Eastern Region
