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

Our History

- Established March 1, 1988 by act of the General Assembly
 - Instrumentality of the Commonwealth
 - "State-affiliated entity"
- 34 full-time staff members
- Governed by a 13-member Board of Directors

Our Fast Facts

- We provide complete project financing with no matching funds or tap fee contributions required
- We can fund most project costs from start to finish including engineering, legal, permits, etc., excluding Act 537 sewage planning
- We are primarily a revolving loan program, not a grant program
- We can work with other funding programs and serve as a "local match"
- We do not refinance previous projects and/or long-term debt
- We have the "cheapest money" you can find today
- We're from the government... and we're here to help!

- We can provide financing to most public or private entities in the Commonwealth
- All projects must have a positive water quality impact
- Drinking water projects must involve a system with a PWSID




Our Budget (FY 24-25)



- \$1 billion total!
- Includes \$46 million additional grant funding from last year's budgeted amount
- Funding is spread "equally" across the PENNVEST quarterly board meetings

Our Budget (FY 24-25)

- Additional funds available through the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL)
- Covers clean water and drinking water projects
- Factored into our current budget calculations
 - Applicants considered for these funds through regular PENNVEST process, no special application

Our Regulatory Requirements

- Wastewater projects should consider completing architectural and engineering (A/E) procurement
- Prior to design, we recommend contacting PENNVEST and PA DEP staff for RFQ and DBE procedures
- Applicants who do not complete this are still PENNVEST eligible, but projects that ultimately receive federal equivalency funding...
 - 1. Must self-fund the A/E portion of the project costs; or
 - 2. Will be given a separate funding award solely for A/E costs



Planning Consultation

- Mandatory meeting for each project and application
- Should be held 3 to 9 months in advance of PENNVEST application submission
- Can be held in-person or virtually
 - Applicant
 - Applicant's engineer
 - PENNVEST Project Specialist
 - PA DEP representatives
 - Other state officials

Environmental Clearances

- Projects <u>must</u> be "shovel ready" at the time of application submission
- All design work must be complete with environmental-related permits issued and in hand
- Biddable plans and specifications must be made available for PA DEP Municipal Facilities Division review
- Contact PA DEP regional office early in the process to discuss permits and avoid delays

 - Loan vs. non-repayment amounts
 - Interest rates


Construction/Disbursement

- Construction may begin after settlement is complete
 - <u>Do not</u> begin construction or material acquisition early – renders project ineligible
 - Exceptions granted via a Letter of No Prejudice (LONP) request
- Payments and change orders processed 100% electronically via PENNVEST portal
- Interest-only payments up to 36 months during construction



10 Project Closeout

- Submit final payment request via PENNVEST portal
 - PA DEP, PENNVEST, and other state/local officials will participate in on-site final inspection
 - A five percent holdback applies to project disbursement until inspection is complete
- PENNVEST reconciles final costs and moves project to repayment status



Funding Determination Process

Funding Limits: Stormwater Projects

- Based upon number of municipalities currently served and/or proposed to be served by a project
- PENNVEST does not require a stormwater user rate or fee to be charged

TOTAL FUNDING CANNOT EXCEED (whichever is less)*

- \$1,000 per resident within the municipalities served
- \$10 million flat cap

*See 35 P.S. § 751.10

Funding Limits: All Other Projects

- Based upon number of municipalities currently served and/or proposed to be served by a project
- Includes both direct-billed customers and bulk service to other municipalities or municipal authorities

ONE MUNICIPALITY SERVED

• \$11 million per application

TWO OR THREE MUNICIPALITIES SERVED

• \$20 million per application

FOUR OR MORE MUNICIPALITIES SERVED

 No limit with supermajority vote of PENNVEST Board of Directors

Offer Determination

TARGET RATE

- Median household income
- DCED Early Warning Score
 - 0.5 to 1.25*
 - Lowered for BIL funding
- Rate of inflation

RESULTING RATE

- Annual debt service of proposed PENNVEST loan
- Current annual debt of borrower
- Annual O&M costs of borrower's system

^{*}All stormwater projects = uniform 0.25 score


RESULTING RATE AT OR BELOW TARGET RATE

- All loan
- Interest rates vary by county and are adjusted annually, typically in the spring
- Unless an applicant submits immediately before a rate adjustment, rates are fixed at time of submission

RESULTING RATE ABOVE TARGET RATE

- Hardship considerations
 - Reduced interest rate as low as 1% for full term
 - Non-repayment (grant)
 - Extend loan term to 30 years
- Grant funds are often prorated due to demand and not guaranteed

Offer Determination

- For traditional PENNVEST applications, we use a uniform funding calculation across all 67 counties
- Applicants will receive the best offer we can provide in accordance with our program limitations and available funding
- We suggest exploring other funding as a backup plan

Special Funding Opportunities

Advance Funding Program

- Covers design and engineering costs to get to a "shovel ready" stage
 - Act 537 planning costs in eligible
- Up to \$2 million
 - 5-year term, typically all loan
 - Interest only for 59 months with onetime balloon payment at month 60
- If system applies for and closes PENNVEST construction financing before 60 months, ballon payment is waived, and loan term is extended to match the construction loan term

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS

- Brand new start-up systems with no user rate or funding source to support initial planning and design costs
- New or existing systems...
 - in a "disadvantaged community" per the Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) Economic Justice Screening Tool
 - in a PA DEP-defined Environmental Justice (EJ) area
 - denied by other lenders and unable to secure interim financing elsewhere

Small Project Initiative (SPI)

- Quick turnaround, processed outside of traditional cut-off dates
- Apply anytime during the year
- \$500,000 PENNVEST funding limit
 - Loan only, no grant, 20-year term
 - Uses county cap interest rates
- Total project cost cannot exceed \$1 million including contingency
- State funds guaranteed
 - No federal dollars and associated regulatory requirements

Population of 12,000 people or less

Hookups of 1,000 or less

Agricultural operation

(some exceptions)

Programmatic Financing (Pro-Fi)

- Bundle a series of projects on an approved capital improvement plan under one PENNVEST application
 - Only one project must be shovel ready
 - Implement remaining projects over a three-year period
- Loan only, no grant
- Locks in the county cap interest rate

Lead Service Line Replacement


- Special incentives under BIL funding for lead service lines and goosenecks
 - Full lead line replacement required
 - Requires a separate application in the PENNVEST system
 - Can be paired with another project
- Higher chance of grant funding with revised financial calculation
- Risk mitigation measures must be followed per EPA and PA DEP rules, these are eligible PENNVEST costs



Example lead gooseneck and corroded lead service line Erie City Water Authority - City of Erie, Erie County

Emerging Contaminant Funding

- Targeted towards drinking water, but some wastewater systems may also be eligible
- Primary focus is PFAS in drinking water systems
- Uses normal PENNVEST application and cut-off dates
- Higher chance of grant funding, otherwise, all loan or a loan/grant combination will be awarded depending on funding demand



Solar Projects

- Must be tied to needs of a drinking water or wastewater facility
 - May be standalone application or complimentary to a larger project
 - Cannot exceed needs of the facility
 - Facility owner/operator must be the applicant
- Must comply with all other PENNVEST application requirements
- Technical assistance available at pasolarcenter.org

Homeowner Sewage Program

- Administered by the Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency (PHFA)
- Fixed rate of 1.75% (up to 2.8% APR)
 - Maximum 20-year term, 15-year term for manufactured homes
 - \$25,000 maximum loan amount
 - No household income limits
- Homeowners contact PHFA directly and work with a participating lender


