



Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI), also known as **bird flu**, is a contagious virus that affects wild birds, poultry, and sometimes mammals.

Protect Yourself, Your Community, Your Dogs, Wildlife, and Backyard Birds from Bird Flu

Hunter and Trappers

Watch for symptoms like fever, cough, sore throat, headache, muscle aches, eye redness or irritation, or breathing trouble for **10 days** after having contact with game.

Dogs Can Carry the Virus

Seek veterinary care immediately if they show signs of being sick. Call ahead before seeing a health care provider or veterinarian to let them know about a possible bird flu exposure.
