Hunters and trappers play a pivotal role in safeguarding wildlife health and maintaining game species populations. If you encounter anything abnormal while harvesting or field dressing wildlife, please contact your region's Wildlife Health Technician. Any collected specimens will be used for wildlife disease surveillance and research.

**Any American woodcocks**  
for a nutritional study



**Any hares and Appalachian cottontails**  
for regional health research

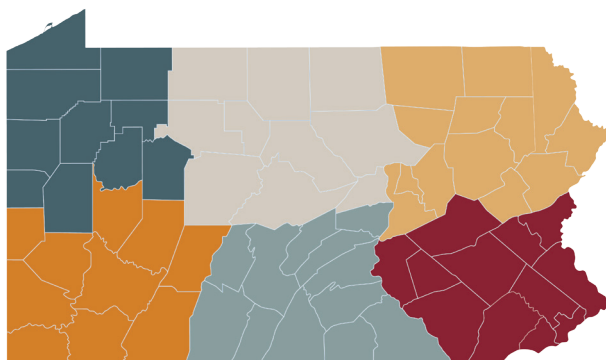


**White-tailed deer, elk, or bears**
