# **UNDERSTANDING WHITE SUPREMACY & WHITE NATIONALISM**

### WHAT IS WHITE SUPREMACY?

The belief (conscious or unconscious) that "pure" white people are superior to people of other races.

# WHAT IS WHITE NATIONALISM?

A political ideology rooted in white supremacy, but focused specifically on building or preserving a white-only nation or political system.

White supremacy is about racial superiority and control; white nationalism is about preserving white-only political and social power. Both shape individuals, institutions, policies, and cultural norms that create unequal outcomes.



## Individual

Beliefs, actions, or behaviors that express racial superiority or hostility.

- Racial slurs, antisemitism, or hate speech.
- Displaying hate symbols.
- Race-or religious-based harassment at work, school, or in public spaces.
- Advocating for racial separatism and/or Christian Nationalism; promoting the "Great Replacement" theory.



# Structural/Systemic

Systems that produce and maintain racial disparities across society.

- Segregated neighborhoods caused by historical and ongoing housing discrimination.
- Underfunded schools in communities of color.
- Health disparities linked to environmental
- Economic inequality driven by unequal access to credit, property ownership, and employment.



### Institutional

Policies or practices within organizations that create or sustain racial inequity (even without explicit intent).

- Unequal disciplinary practices in schools targeting students of color.
- Biased hiring or promotion policies.
- Discriminatory housing practices.
- Over-policing or profiling of certain racial or ethnic communities.



### **Cultural**

Social norms, media, and stories that normalize white dominance or erase other cultures, rejecting multiculturalism.

- Media representation that centers whiteness as "normal" and others as "different."
- School curricula that exclude or distort Black. Indigenous, or immigrant histories.
- Cultural appropriation without acknowledgment or respect.

The PHRC addresses white supremacy and white nationalism through enforcing anti-discrimination laws, public education and outreach, promoting inclusion and diversity, and monitoring hate incidents.

### YOUR RIGHTS UNDER THE PENNSYLVANIA HUMAN RELATIONS ACT

In Pennsylvania it is unlawful to discriminate on the basis of race; color; religious creed; ancestry; national origin; sex; age (40+); familial status (only in housing); disability; the use, handling, or training of support or guide animals for disability; or retaliation. Protections are available in education, employment, housing, commercial property, and public accommodations. If you believe you have experienced discrimination, file a complaint with the PHRC within 180 days of the alleged act of harm.
