**Pennsylvania Disaster Recovery Assistance Program (DRAP)**  
**Annual Household Income Rates**  
**January – December, 2025**

Eligibility to receive a Pennsylvania DRAP grant is based on annual household income. Households earning (gross) below 500% of the most recent U.S. Federal Poverty Guidelines published by the United States Department of Health and Human Services may be eligible to receive DRAP grants.

The table below includes the 500% of current poverty guidelines using current data located on the [US Department of Health and Human Services](https://www.hhs.gov/poverty) website. Households with annual household income (gross) that is lower than the amounts in the table below are eligible to apply for DRAP.

For purposes of DRAP:

- A household is an individual or the number of people living together at one mailing address.
- Annual household income is the combined gross income of all members of the household in the preceding calendar year.
- Gross income is the total amount of money earned in a year before any taxes, healthcare or payroll or deductions are taken out. Gross income is different from net income. Net income is the money taken home after taxes and any deductions are removed.
