Talking Points: Resolve to Be Ready

Holiday Preparedness

- 1. Preparedness as a Gift: Practical gifts like flashlights, first-aid kits, or weather radios help loved ones prepare for emergencies in 2025.
- 2. Starting a Kit: Encourage giving one or two essential items to begin building a home or car emergency kit.
- 3. Winter Travel Safety: Include jumper cables, ice scrapers, or traction aids in a car safety kit gift.

Fire Safety

- 1. Holiday Fire Risks: Seasonal hazards like heaters, cooking, and live trees increase fire risks—take proactive safety steps.
- 2. Fire Safety Gifts: Smoke alarms, carbon monoxide detectors, and fire extinguishers are thoughtful and lifesaving presents.
- 3. Fire Prevention Tips: Keep trees and candles away from heat sources, and use light bulbs with correct wattage.

Emergency Planning

- 1. Family Emergency Plans: Resolve to create a plan with evacuation routes and meeting places. Practice it with your family.
- 2. Communication is Key: Ensure all family members know the plan and how to contact each other during an emergency.
- 3. Community Engagement: Share plans with neighbors and help those who may need extra assistance.

Talking Points: Resolve to Be Ready - Older Adults

Holiday Preparedness

- 1. Specialized Kits: Include medications, hearing aid batteries, or mobility aids in preparedness kits for older adults.
- 2. Comfort and Accessibility: Add blankets, non-slip shoes, and easy-to-open packaging to emergency supplies.
- 3. Car Kit Essentials: Include items like a backup phone charger, warm clothing, and emergency contact information.

Fire Safety


- 1. Mobility Considerations: Plan for safe and accessible evacuation routes in case of fire emergencies.
- 2. Prevention First: Ensure smoke and carbon monoxide alarms are installed and tested monthly.
- 3. Seasonal Safety: Avoid using candles and ensure space heaters are safely positioned and plugged directly into an outlet.

Emergency Planning

- 1. Customized Plans: Create a plan that includes backup power for medical devices and an accessible emergency kit.
- 2. Stay Connected: Share emergency contacts and plans with family, caregivers, or neighbors.
- 3. Community Support: Encourage participation in local preparedness programs or check-ins during severe weather events.

Keep Your Pets Safe This Winter!

Winter can be harsh for our furry friends. Prepare with these tips:

- Limit outdoor time in extreme cold.
- Always dry paws to avoid frostbite.

Pack an Emergency Kit for Your Pets!

Include:

- Food & water (3 days' worth)
- Medications
- Warm blankets
- Updated ID tags

***** a Watch Those Paws!

Ice melt and salt can harm your pet's paws. Protect them with booties or wash paws after walks.

% Pro tip: Keep paw balm handy for dry, cracked pads. Stay safe this winter! #WinterSafety #PetCareTips

☆ % For Outdoor Pets:

- Ensure shelter is insulated and elevated.
- Use straw (not blankets) for bedding to stay dry.
- Provide fresh, unfrozen water at all times. Let's keep all pets cozy this winter! #PetPreparedness #ColdWeatherCare

🚓 🎭 Road Trips with Pets in Winter?

- Pack pet essentials: food, water, and a leash.
- Keep pets warm and never leave them in a cold car.
- Have a plan in case of delays or emergencies. Stay safe and prepared on the go! #WinterTravel #PetSafety

• Know the Signs of Cold Stress in Pets:

- Shivering or whining
- Lethargy
- Weakness

If you notice these, warm your pet immediately and consult a vet. Prevention is key! #PetHealth #WinterSafetyTips



Talking Points: Winter Pet Care

1. Protecting Pets from the Cold

- Limit Outdoor Time: Keep pets indoors during extreme cold and only allow short outdoor trips for bathroom breaks.
- Dry Paws Thoroughly: After walks, dry your pet's paws to prevent frostbite or irritation.
- Invest in Gear: Use pet-friendly sweaters, jackets, or booties to keep them warm and protect their paws.

2. Creating a Pet Emergency Kit

- Pack essentials like:
 - Food and water (at least 3 days' worth).
 - Medications and medical records.
 - A sturdy leash, harness, or carrier for transport.
 - Warm blankets and bedding.
- Store the kit in an accessible location and update it regularly.

3. Ensuring Home and Car Safety

- Home Safety:
 - Keep pets away from space heaters or fireplaces.
 - Ensure they have a warm, draft-free area to sleep.
- Car Safety:
 - Never leave pets alone in a cold car.
 - Carry a pet travel kit, including blankets and backup food.

4. Paws and Snow Safety

- Avoid Salt and Ice Melt:
 - Use pet-safe ice melt around your home.
 - Wash and check paws for cracks or irritation after outdoor walks.
- **Protect with Booties**: Use booties or paw balm to shield paws from the elements.

5. Planning for Winter Travel with Pets

- Include pet essentials in your vehicle emergency kit:
 - Food, water, and a bowl.
 - Leash and ID tags.
 - Blanket or portable bedding.
- Ensure pets are securely transported in a carrier or harness during trips.

6. Recognizing Signs of Cold Stress

- Look for symptoms like:
 - Shivering or whining.
 - Lethargy or weakness.
 - Discoloration of skin or paws.
- Take immediate action to warm your pet and consult a vet if necessary.
